

WASHINGTON NATIONALS DREAM FOUNDATION

The Washington Nationals Dream Foundation (WNDF) and the Washington Nationals Baseball Club are committed to community partnerships that improve the lives of children and families across the Washington Capital Region. The Foundation's three cornerstone programs are focused on children's education, health and recreation:

Washington Nationals Youth Baseball Academy

The Washington Nationals Dream Foundation has partnered with the District of Columbia Government to build the Washington Nationals Youth Baseball Academy, a state-of-the-art facility located east of the Anacostia River in the District's Ward 7. The Academy will provide year-round educational and athletic programming based on the successful model of Harlem RBI, which offers baseball and softball training and skills development as well as academic assistance and vocational training. In May, 2010, the Fort Dupont Park federal land to be used for this facility was transferred to the DC Government, clearing the way for construction. The WNDF provided a \$1 million payment during the preconstruction phase and will pay out the remaining \$2.5 million dollars over ten years in support of the facility. Additionally, the WNDF will continue to raise funds for the Academy, which will open in 2013.

Washington Nationals Diabetes Care Complex

The Washington Nationals Dream Foundation provided the lead gift of \$2 million for the construction of the Washington Nationals Diabetes Care Complex at Children's National Medical Center. Children's National currently cares for more than 1,500 children and adolescents with Type 1, Type 2 and other forms of diabetes. No child has ever been turned away, and the Center's Childhood and Adolescent Diabetes Program is the preeminent pediatric diabetes program in the Washington Metropolitan area. The Diabetes Care Complex was completed in June, 2013, and offers a multi-disciplinary approach to supporting children with diabetes and their families. The facility houses classrooms, state-of-the-art treatment rooms, a multi-functional education center, a media room, a demonstration kitchen, computer kiosks and various other tools to empower families battling diabetes. The new Diabetes Care Complex has improved and expanded the excellent diabetes program at Children's National.

The Neighborhood Initiative

Grants and in-kind donations are among the various resources provided to local nonprofit organizations that are dedicated to improving the Southeast/Southwest DC neighborhoods surrounding Nationals Park and beyond. To date, the WNDF has donated more than \$420,000 to non-profit organizations that improve the lives of children and families. Recipients include:
